

Purpose of the 1998 User's Guide Supplement

The NCANDS DCDC User's Guide Annual Supplement, 1998 is intended for use with the National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) Detailed Case Data Component User's Guide and Codebook. The User's Guide contains a general overview of the NCANDS project and detailed descriptions of the variables contained in the J and K files. This Supplement contains information specific to the 1998 NCANDS files, DCDC98_J and DCDC98_K. There are four sections presented in the following order:

- a table indicating whether a state archived data in the years 1995 through 1999
- a table of the total number of records in the DCDC98 J and DCDC98 K files by state
- counts of the DCDC98 J and DCDC98 K variables by state
- additional data considerations, if any, conclude the document

History of State Submissions to NCANDS

States began submitting Summary Data Components in 1990 and Detailed Case Data Components in 1995. Black squares in the table cells below indicate years in which individual states submitted DCDCs and gave permission for the data to be contributed to NDACAN.

Please note that some states submit DCDC data, but do not permit these data to be archived with NDACAN. Therefore, these states are not included in the datasets.

1998 File Names and Record Counts

Twelve states archived J and K files in 1998. The combined *DCDC98_J* file contains 14 variables and includes information about all reports of *alleged* maltreatment and all the children involved in these reports. All child fatalities have been excluded from the file. The unit of observation in the file is a report/child pair. There may be, therefore, more than one report per child in the file or more than one child per report. See the *Report and Child Identification Codes* in the *NCANDS User's Guide and Codebook* for more information.

The *DCDC98_K* file contains 62 variables and includes information about all reports of *substantiated* or *indicated* maltreatment, and descriptive information about all the child victims in these reports. All child fatalities have been excluded from the file. The unit of observation consists of a report/child pair.

For example, looking down Vermont's column, it is apparent that the state did not submit a number of variables in 1998.
